Preparation Steps

Smartphone (iPhone or Android)
or tablet (iPad or Android)
with a front facing camera



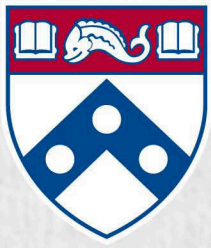
Operating system:

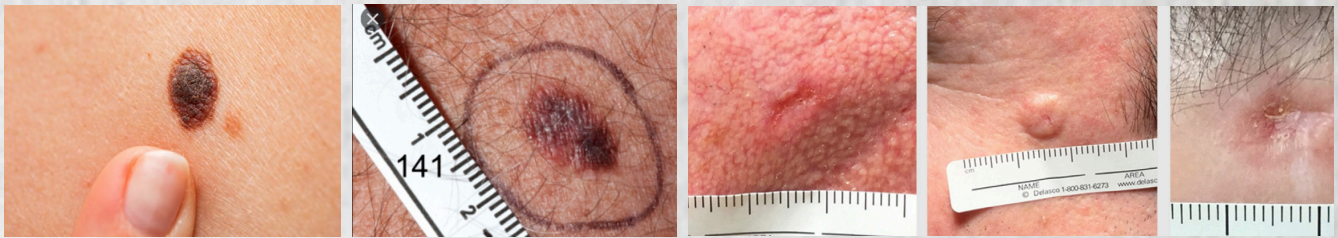

Photo Tips for Teledermatology

Requirements



Please send two (2) close-up photos of your lesion with a ruler to show the size

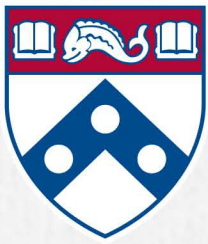


Please send one (1) photo from further away showing where the lesion is on your body (e.g. arm, leg, face)



PLEASE NOTE:

- Each message only allows a maximum of two (2) photos, please send multiple messages if you have more.
- If you do not send enough images, or if images are blurry, you may be asked to send more.




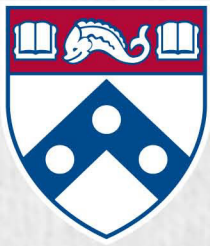
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Photo Tips for Teledermatology

Taking photos

- A** Be sure to be in a well-lit room with good lighting
- B** Ensure the lens and screen is cleaned before each use (a soft microfiber cloth can be used)
- C** Hold the camera horizontally (for landscape photos) with both hands/fingers placed to the far edge of the camera
- D** Tuck your elbows into your chest  to provide more stability when taking the photo
- E** Be sure not to block the lens when you take the photo
- F** Ensure the flash function is turned off



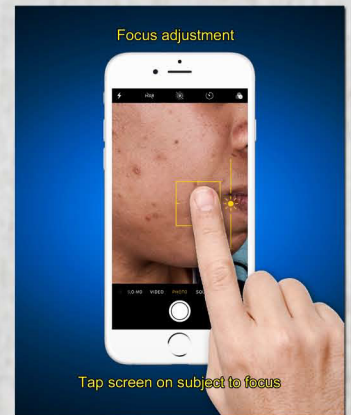

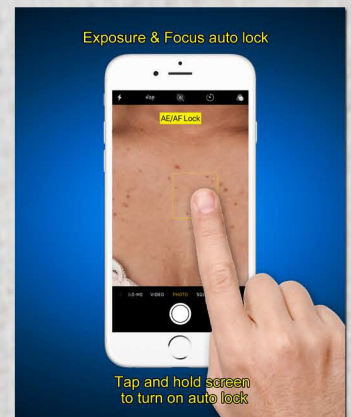
Camera Adjustments



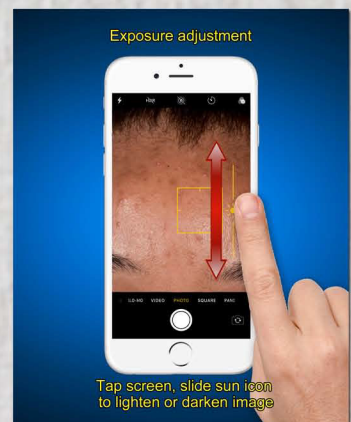
Tap the LCD screen on the subject to focus the camera

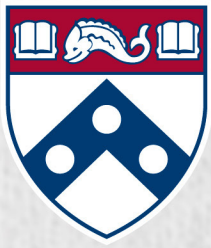


Tapping and holding on the screen will turn on the auto lock for exposure and focus based on what was selected as the subject



Tapping the screen will also allow for manual exposure adjustment if necessary. When the box appears touch and slide the sun icon up or down to increase or decrease the exposure as needed





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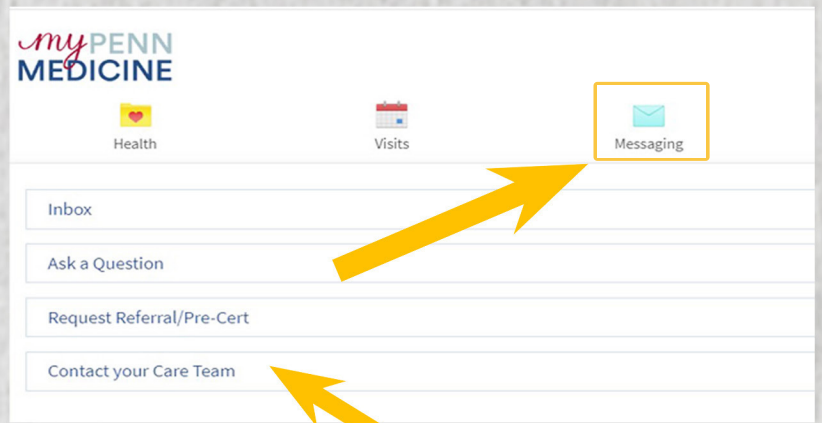

Label the image & attach another

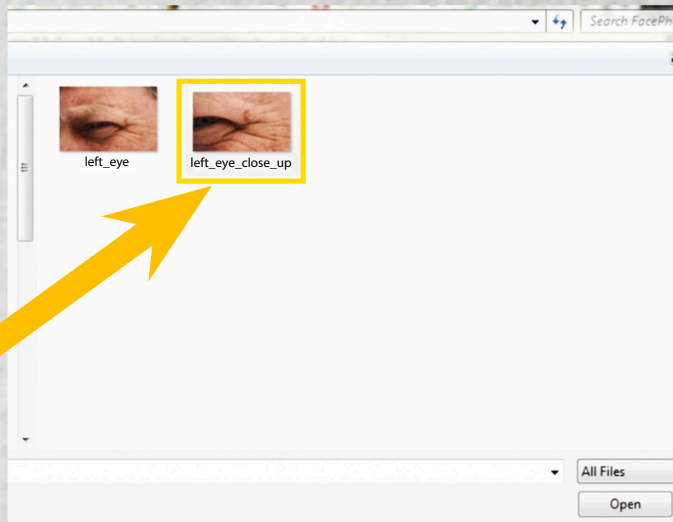
